## FITTING TRIBUTE

### Bridge named for former Supreme Court chief justice

CHESTERFIELD — It seems only fitting the Chesterfield Arch Bridge be named for Harlan Fiske Stone.

The Chesterfield native was 16 years old when the first bridge was built across the Connecticut River at that site connecting Vermont and New Hampshire in 1889. By the time flooding took it down in 1936 and the arch bridge was built the following year, Stone was an associate justice of the U.S. Supreme Court.

This past Sunday, his grandson, Harlan Fiske Stone 2nd, was given the honor of unveiling a plaque with his grandfather's likeness dedicating the bridge to him.

Gov. John H. Lynch designated it the Justice Harlan Fiske Stone Bridge last year.
